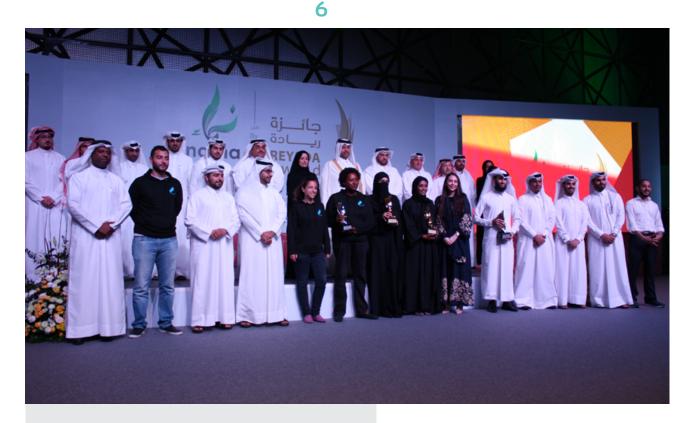

Nama Center, one of Qatar Foundation for Social Work's affiliated centers, has organized a special ceremony to honor the teachers and students who participated in its 'Sekik' life skills development program, in the presence of the heads of departments and media representatives, at 'Ain Khaled' Hall, in the center's headquarters. Awards were given to teachers for their excellent performance during the training.

Seven educational projects have been implemented as part of the 'Sekik' program, inspired by everyday life skills. Participating schools competed to offer their best through implementing the workshops and creatively presenting information. Hanan Amin Al-Tairi, from Amna Bint Wahab Preparatory School for Girls, won the first place, and Shrooq Al-Mohannadi, from the Qatar Independent School of Banking and Business Administration for Girls, came in the second place. The third place went to Huda Musawi Osman, from Amna Bint Wahab Independent Secondary School for Girls.

'Sekik' program aims at improving life styles and skills, the main engine for developing youth capacities to become effective and productive members in the community. Through its 'Sekik' project, NAMA seeks to build the capacities and minds of young people to enable them to think positively, perform better in life, and strengthen their identity. The project is divided into two programs. The first is the "Life Skills Training Program", which revolves around developing the training capacity of teachers so that they can properly deal with the students and train them to develop their basic cognitive and life skills. The second program is the "Life Enhancement Training Program", which involves providing students with the personal and social skills necessary to take steps towards achieving their goals. It also aims at helping students better understand their personal behaviors and improve their self-esteem so as to shape a brighter future for themselves and their community. The teachers delivered 32 workshops in 10 different schools, with nearly 130 educational activities offered to students. These activities focused on enhancing personal and social skills

Qatar University (QU) and six community centers which are under the supervision of Qatar Foundation for Social Work (QFSW) signed on June 7 six research contracts to conduct research projects.

The contracts were signed by QU Vice President for Research and Graduate Studies Prof Mariam Al-Maadeed, on behalf of the Center for Humanities and Social Sciences (CHSS) at Qatar University College of Arts and Sciences (QU-CAS), and QFSW Executive Director and Shafallah Center for Persons with Disabilities CEO Ms. Amaal Bint Abdullatif Al-Mannai, Ehsan Centre for Empowerment and Elderly Care Director Mr. Mubarak bin Abdul Aziz Al Khalifa, NAMA Center for Social Development Acting Executive Manager Mrs. Maryam Bint Abdullatif Al-Mannai, Aman Center for Protection and Social Rehabilitation Acting Director Mr. Mansoor Al Saadi, Dreama Orphans Care Center Director Ms. Mariam bint Ali Al Misnad, and Wifaq Family Consulting Center Director Mr. Rashid bin Ahmed Al Doosari.

Attending the event were QU President Dr. Hassan Al Derham, QU Chief Strategy and Development Officer Dr. Darwish Al Emadi, CHSS Director Dr. Kaltham Ali Al Ghanim, and CAS Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Studies Prof. Hala Sultan Saif Al-Easa, as well as QU officials and representatives of the partnering centers.

The contracts agreement aims to strengthen cooperation in the field of social and human research between QU, QFSW, and civil society and non-governmental organizations (NGOs). The terms of the contracts include collaboration between CHSS and QFSW centers (Shafallah Center for Persons with Disabilities, Ehsan Centre for Empowerment and Elderly Care, NAMA Center for Social Development, Aman Center for Protection and Social Rehabilitation, Dreama Orphans Care Center, and Wifaq Family Consulting Center). This collaboration is based on preparing and conducting research and field work by QU research groups for the benefit of these centers and for the purpose of developing their services.

In her remarks, Prof Mariam Al-Maadeed said: "We seek to support research and develop the community's capabilities by supporting civil society organizations, initiatives and efforts that serve all members of the society, in line with QU's vision and Qatar National Vision 2030."

Ms. Amaal Bint Abdullatif Al-Mannai said: "This partnership comes within the framework of implementing our vision in applying the best practices to integrate it with experience on the ground in addition to applying the international experiences in these areas and to adapting them to suit the Qatari community." She also noted that the pact is a reflection of the pioneering role played by QFSW and the entities working under its umbrella in enhancing the capabilities and developing the mechanisms of social work in Qatar, and in implementing the Qatar National Vision 2030 and





the sustainable development goals (SDGs).

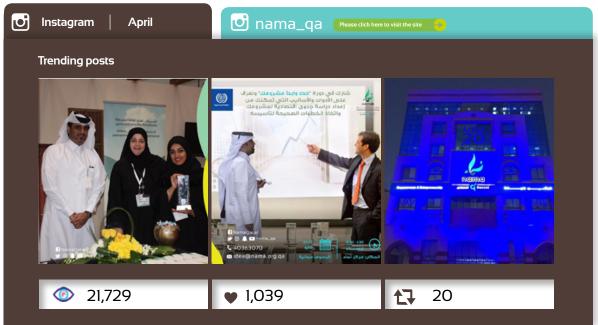

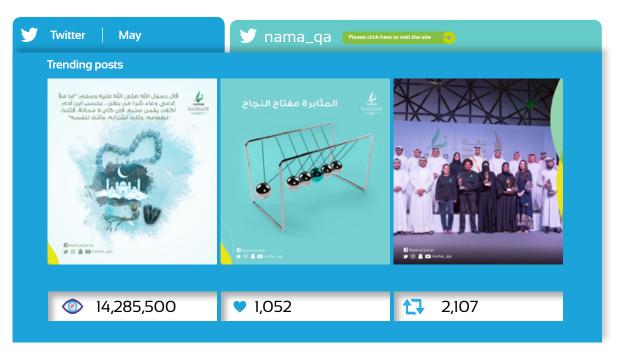


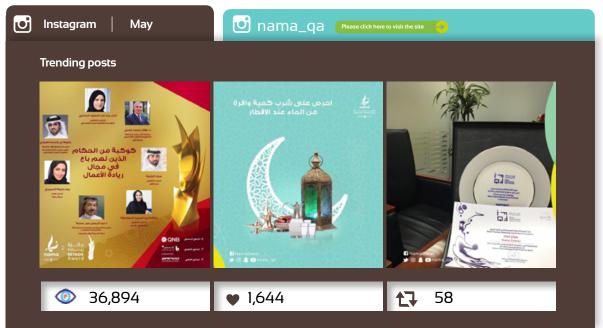
